News from President Tina Williams

Greetings, INFBPW Sisters!

By the time you read this letter, you will have no doubt noticed a couple of changes in our spring HBW. Number one, you are receiving your publication a little later than you usually do. Number two, the location for State Convention has changed. Here is the explanation for both of these changes.

Back in November, I started leaving messages at Clarion Inn requesting they email the contract for review. My phone calls were not returned, and no contract was ever emailed. Over the next couple of days, we put our heads together to figure out how to completely revamp our plans for state convention. The main question we had was this: "How do we put a convention together fast, with quality speakers and events, which will help our members and provide a memorable banquet and installation service for our incoming officers AND stay within our budget?" Ultimately, the answer became obvious. Move State Convention to Fort Wayne.

Many of you know that Diane is a Fort Wayne native. She has many, many connections there, which enabled her to literally re-organize our convention in less than two weeks! We were also very fortunate to find a hotel that could accommodate our group. Hotel Fort Wayne (formerly the Marriott) is located just off Interstate 69. Their Sales Director Sheila Dean has been very accommodating and very sympathetic toward our situation.
