
### Workshop and Keynote Speakers



# Do You Have a "Jennie Scott?"

This award has been established to recognize an INFBPW member who has made the greatest contribution toward the objectives of our Federation in the local organization and in INFBPW during the year of competition.

The purpose of the award is to encourage members to be involved at all levels of INFBPW, including leadership responsibilities, attendance and participation at local, district, and state meetings.

A certificate of recognition and a \$25.00 cash award will be presented to the recipient at Fall Conference.

A nominee must have been a local organization member in good standing for at least five (5) consecutive years. The member must have a record of at least 80% attendance at local organization meetings and have sponsored at least one (1) new member during the period of competition (June 1 through May 31 of the nomination year). The nominee must be an active participant in the local organization's activities. Although emphasis will be placed on current activities, a member's INFBPW background of past activities, honors, and accomplishments will be considered. The biographical sketch for each nominee should include past club history and district activities, including offices held. The nominee must not currently be a member of the INFBPW Executive Committee. A member may be nominated more than once, but may only receive the award one time.

Nominations for this award must originate from a local organization in good standing. Nominations shall have the approval of the executive committee of the recipient's local organization. Only one nominee from each local organization will be permitted, and all nominations must be submitted to the State Office using the form provided at <a href="http://infbpw.org">http://infbpw.org</a>.

The deadline for nominations is September 15.

# District 3

We met at The Landing in Terre Haute for our Spring District Meeting, with President-Elect Joyce Nessel as our speaker and with Madison Wood as our District Essay Contest Winner. Secretaries' and treasurers' reports were presented from District 5 and from District 3, and a vote was taken regarding the balances of the two treasuries. By-Laws were satisfactory to-date, but work will be needed for revising the standing rules.

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
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
